
Melbourne East Regional Sport and Recreation Strategy Group

- Includes a recommendation to implement the Victorian Government Fair Access Policy Roadmap consistently across the region




















MERSRS Fair Access Policy

MERSRS Fair Access Policy - **Next Steps**

Provide **training and education** to sports clubs to continue to increase Fair Access awareness and knowledge in sports clubs.

Foster **continued collaboration** across Eastern Region Councils to deliver Fair Access actions.

Continue to collaborate with stakeholders such as **State Sporting Associations**, **leagues and clubs**, to implement Fair Access principles.

Improve data reliability collection across the region.

Review and assess the actions outlined in the MERSRS **Fair Access Evaluation Plan**
