AusPlay Data Webinar

We were joined by Gary Rauber, Assistant Director at the Australian Sports Commission, as we hosted a webinar diving into the world of AusPlay Data. Australia's national sport and physical activity survey, AusPlay, has been undergoing its biggest change since it was launched in 2015. Whilst the survey continues to collect a wealth of information on participation to inform strategy and planning (in fact, it now collects more data than ever before), the way in which that data is gathered has shifted from telephone to online.

Thanks to all who came along and took part in the session as we explored why and how the survey has changed, the improvements that have been made, and what practitioners can expect when first results from the new method are released later this year. Leadership Program

Parks and Leisure Australia Vic/Tas are thrilled to have hosted our annual Leadership Program this August delivered by CEO and leadership mentor, Cameron Schwab from <u>designCEO</u>, and supported by our partners <u>Green by Nature</u>.

Participants took part in four sessions focused on high-performance leadership habits to enable and establish daily practice of leadership excellence. The program is designed to prepare leaders for high-impact leadership roles, recognising the need to perform well now while at all times evolving your leadership game. Melbourne Park Managers Forum

The Melbourne Park Managers Forum (MPMF) is thrilled to have held the 2024 Park Managers Forum and Site Tour in the Docklands, hosted by the City of Melbourne. Park managers and senior management staff from a range of Melbourne Metropolitan LGAs came together to explore public space sites across the City of Melbourne and share resources and information relating to parks planning, management and operations. The day began with curated presentations and a Q and A session, before braving the Melbourne weather to head out for site visits across the City.

- Stop 1: Up first, it was a full house at the Greenline Project Hub learning all about how the north bank of the Yarra River Birrarung will be transformed.
- On Route: Then we braved the weather as we headed on foot to our next stop via the world-first trial to reintroduce mistletoe to the trees of Melbourne.
- Stop 2: Our next stop, Southbank Boulevard and Dodd St, where this once busy street has been transformed into one of Australia's most pedestrian-friendly places.
- Via Laneways: Exploring Melbourne's laneways on the way to our next stop, as we heard about City of Melbourne's Green Your Laneway program turning city laneways into leafy, green and welcoming places for the community.
- Stop 3: 'Rocks on Wheels' designed by Mike Hewson and inspired by the Diane Arbus photograph with the same title. An exciting space for risky play, challenging the conventions of playgrounds, public artworks and landscape projects.

Designing and Maintaining Grass Sports Fields Webinar

With a growing population we need to not only deliver more green field spaces to meet the needs of the community sport and recreation use but also maximise the carrying capacity of existing sports fields. However, there are challenges for Councils to delivering and managing these spaces to make them suitable for play all year round.

With this in mind we held a webinar on World Soil Day (WSD) 2024 delving into this important discussion surrounding how to design and maintain grass sports fields to keep them open more weeks of the year so people can be more active more often.

We were thrilled to hear from the team at <u>SPORTENG</u> as they dove into design considerations in constructing grass sports fields for community use with an insight into short and long-term design thinking and cost considerations. While maintenance experts <u>Green by Nature</u> walked attendees through some of the lessons learnt in turf management, and why choosing the right type of grass is important in maximising use throughout the year and keeping fields suitable for play for longer.

Tree-friendly Pavements Webinar

Parks and Leisure Australia VIC/TAS were thrilled to host a webinar with the team at <u>Porous</u> <u>Lane</u> exploring their state-of-the-art pavement technology developed via research undertaken in collaboration with the University of Melbourne.

Porous Lane's innovative permeable pavement has been adopted by numerous councils to support sustainable infrastructure, particularly in parklands and around trees. Made from up to 50% Australian recycled tyre material, Porous Lane offers a range of multifaceted benefits, including passive irrigation, stormwater treatment, reduced excavation needs, and minimized risk of cracks and trip hazards from tree root movement.

The presentation covered the extensive research background behind Porous Lane's technology, which includes rigorous laboratory testing and field monitoring conducted in collaboration with the University of Melbourne, ensuring its effectiveness and durability in real-world applications.

Costs with Designing + Building a Field of Play Webinar

Parks and Leisure Australia Vic/Tas were thrilled to host a webinar this week in collaboration with our partners <u>SPORTENG</u> exploring the costs associated with designing and building a Field of Play.

In the world of sports engineering, two fundamental processes stand at the forefront: designing and building. While they may seem intertwined, each plays a distinct role in creating innovative sports equipment, facilities, and experiences.

Designing is the initial phase of the development process, focusing on conceptualisation and planning. Building is the execution phase that transforms designs into tangible products. While designing and building serve different purposes, they are deeply interconnected. A well-designed product is only as good as its construction, and builders rely on the detailed specifications provided by designers.

The cost of designing and building a Field of Play can vary widely depending on factors like the size of the field, the type of playing surface (natural grass vs. artificial turf vs. hard surface), location, desired amenities (lighting, seating), and required site preparation. In this webinar, experts SPORTENG covered some of the key cost components that might be required and what the current market trends are. Attendees participated in a cost planning exercise in real time for 'PLA Reserve' getting a first-hand look at what really goes into the process of designing and building fit for purpose Fields of Play.

<u>Nature Stewards</u> is a multi-week course that connects curious people with their local and wider habitats. The course promotes environmental awareness and stewardship through discovery, action and ongoing learning.

Our content and curriculum are developed and delivered by leading scientists, conservation experts, Traditional Owners and environmental educators.

We've run over 45 courses with local councils and other organisations across Victoria for over 750 participants. We've worked with amazing expert facilitators, guest presenters and enjoyed some fabulous field trips.

In this webinar one of our current hosts, the City of Greater Geelong, shared a brief overview from a host perspective. We also dived into some more details about the program and end with an interactive Q&A session.
