

APPENDIX 4K-ATTACHMENT 1, INDIGENOUS ASSESSMENT

The following additional information has been provided by Indigenous groups who took part in the Indigenous Cultural Heritage study of Glen Rock.

1. The **Ugarupul Tribe Traditional Owners** are the descendants of Bobby Anderson and the Ugarupul Tribe (contact Mr Joe Graham)
2. The **Yuggera/Yuggarabul** are represented by the Sandy family (contact Des Sandy)

Rudy and Des Sandy's family have many connections to the Boonah, Laidley, Logan and Ipswich area. Their great grandfather was Bungaree and their great-great-grandfather was Billin, or Jackey Jackey, "King of the Logan". Billin's daughter, Emily, married Willy Williams. Further family history research is presently being undertaken.

2. The **Yuggera People** are represented by the Turner and Thompson families (contact Sonny Thompson)

Consultant anthropologist Natalie Kwok for FAIRA is preparing the Thompson-Turner family history. A great-great-grandmother, Amy Turner, was the daughter of "king" Billy who lived on his traditional land near Gatton. The Thompson family was in possession of a brass breast plate inscribed 'King Billy Turner Blackfellows Creek Lockyer Valley WA Cross' which was donated to the Queensland Museum in 1996 by Meryl Thompson. Cross's selection on a resumed part of Tenthill run was just outside Gatton.

Patricia Thompson has historical links with the Glen Rock property. Her maternal grandmother was employed as a cook during the D'Arcy's ownership of the Glen Rock property. Her grandmother was Princey Carlo who was married to Henry Willoughby when she worked on Glen Rock. Princey's first husband, family name Jacobs, was Patricia's grandfather.
